

Business Manager's Notes

Greetings Brothers and Sisters and Happy Labor Day! I'm happy to report that our work outlook remains good across all sectors of our Brotherhood. Although work remains good, there are some concerning issues looming out there that could adversely affect our livelihood in the short term. The pandemic continues to have an impact on our everyday lives and supply chain problems have slowed or delayed some of our work. At the time of this writing, mask mandates have been put in place, and with the FDA approval of vaccines, I believe we can expect to see widespread vaccine requirements from customers coming to jobsites soon. I have been fully vaccinated and encourage others to do the same. Vaccines and masks are science, not politics. I also want everyone to keep in mind that this virus affects everyone differently and you shouldn't minimize the seriousness of it because you had it or you knew someone who had it, that didn't get very sick. The person you are sitting next to in the breakroom may have a friend or family member that was hospitalized or even died from COVID. We have lost members to COVID and others have been hospitalized, please think before you speak when around co-workers or customers.

Also, energy legislation has not been passed yet. Labor and environmentalists continue to work with legislators and the Governor's office to come up with a bill that will address green energy, utility investment, decarbonization, and allow the Byron and Dresden nuclear plants to continue operating. Hopefully an agreement will be reached, and a bill passed that will preserve and expand IBEW jobs here in Illinois. We continue to advocate for a bill with strong labor standards such as prevailing wage requirements to ensure that the new energy future is built by IBEW members.

We continue to be challenged by the amount of work in our local. If you are working on the road, I'm asking that you please consider coming home to help man our work. We have worked hard over the years to gain market share and if we are unable to fill calls, we will undoubtedly lose work to the non-union. We have our refuel outage at Clinton Power Station and it looks like the Mueller's Foundry project is finally going to need significant manpower starting in September. Please check the job hotline and help us fill these calls. We also continue to actively recruit non-union electricians to join our ranks. If you know of someone who is working in the electrical field outside of the IBEW please refer them to JD Miller or our office to set up a meeting.

Lastly, the Labor movement lost a giant with the passing of AFL-CIO President Richard Trumka. President Trumka was a tireless advocate for working men and women across the country. He will not be easily replaced and will certainly be missed. With his passing, IBEW Sister Liz Shuler has been selected as the new President of the AFL-CIO. We should all be proud to have a fellow IBEW member running the largest Labor Organization in this country. She is also the first woman to lead the labor movement.
